WHAT YOU NEED

YOU CAN TAKE THE GED® TEST IF YOU:

- Are at least 18 years old
- Are 16 or 17 years old and have the completed paperwork that your state may require
- Aren't enrolled in high school

Check your state policies for any additional requirements to take the GED® test in your area.


The GED® test is made up of **4 test subjects**



Reasoning Through Language Arts (RLA)



Science



Mathematical Reasoning



Social Studies

To pass the GED® test, get a score of **145** in each subject. Get a score of **165** in any subject to earn GED® College Ready or **175** to earn GED® College Ready + Credit in that subject.



Both the GED® College Ready and the GED® College Ready + Credit scores mean you are ready to take college level courses. Earn the GED® College Ready + Credit score and you could receive up to 10 college credits to apply to your course of study.




Reasoning Through Language Arts

- 150 minutes
- Includes a 10-minute break
- Includes one essay that you have 45 minutes to write
- Measures your:
 - » Ability to read closely, write clearly, and edit and understand written text
 - » Ability to understand, interpret, and answer questions based on text
 - » Ability to use evidence to support an argument
 - » Understanding of basic English skills at a level needed to succeed in college or a job



Mathematical Reasoning

- 115 minutes
- 2 parts with a short break
 - » No calculator allowed on the first part
 - » You can use a TI-30XS calculator for the remaining questions
- Math formulas and a calculator reference guide provided
- Measures your problem-solving abilities in the following areas:






Science

- No break
- Can use a TI-30XS calculator
- Measures your:
 - » Ability to read, understand, and interpret social studies-related texts
 - » Problem-solving abilities in social studies-related situations

Where do I get GED Ready®?

You can buy the GED Ready® practice test at GED.com.

You can also take the GED Ready® practice test in most adult education centers.

Once the practice test tells you that you're ready, you should schedule and take that GED® test subject as soon as possible.

How do I schedule my test?

Scheduling your test is easier than ever. Just log into your GED® account and click on the "Schedule Test" button to make your appointment.

What is included in my score report?

My Scores – See how you did on your test. Your GED Ready practice test score will also tell you how likely you are to pass the GED.

Written Response & Resources – Access resources for scoring higher on the written response, as well as:

- GED® test — See your written response scores (for Reasoning Through Language Arts only)
- GED Ready® practice test — Working with a teacher? Show your written answers to your teacher so they can grade your responses



When can I expect my scores?

GED Ready® practice test scores will be ready as soon as you finish the test.

GED® test scores are usually ready in 3 hours or less. Sometimes it can take a few days. You'll get an email letting you know when your scores are ready.

Likely to Pass (145–200)




You're ready and should schedule your test.

Too Close To Call (134–144)



You may be ready, but should study more before you take the test.

Not Likely to Pass (100-133)



You need to study more before you take the test.

GED® College Ready + Credit (175-200)



You passed and scored in the highest possible range. Not only did you show that you are ready to take college level courses, you may be eligible for up to 10 college credit hours.

GED® College Ready (165-174)



You passed and showed that you are ready to take college level courses, and you may qualify for waivers from placement testing.

Pass / High School Equivalency (145-164)



Congratulations! You passed and showed the same skills as a graduating high school senior.

Below Passing (100-144)



You did not pass and need to retake the test.

AFTER THE TEST,

How do I get my transcript and diploma?



Once you've passed all 4 test subjects, you can get your transcript and diploma in the "My Scores" section of your GED® account.

NOW WHAT?

What if I don't pass?

Didn't pass your test? Don't worry! Here's what you need to know about retaking your test:

- Use your personal study plan from your Enhanced Score Report to study before you try again.
- Once you're ready to try again, schedule your retake in your GED® account.
- You can retake the test right away, if your state doesn't have any policies about waiting.

We'll help pay for your in-person retake! For every subject you don't pass, you'll get \$20 off your next 2 in-person retakes in that subject. Plus, some states may give you an extra discount!
